


2018 EQUITY ELECTION GUIDE

Changes in the racial and ethnic makeup of Minnesota's population is shifting at the same time as the population ages, bringing challenges and opportunities along the way. The Voices and Choices for Children Coalition encourages community members to engage with candidates at all levels and center questions regarding equity during this year's elections.

Minnesota's Changing Demographics:

The Minnesota State Demographic Center estimates that by 2035 people of color and American Indians will make up 25 percent of Minnesota's population. Sixty percent of the state's total projected population growth from 2013 to 2035 will be in populations of color. The future of the state hinges on the success of all Minnesotans, and particularly on improving outcomes for the growing number of children of color across the state.
